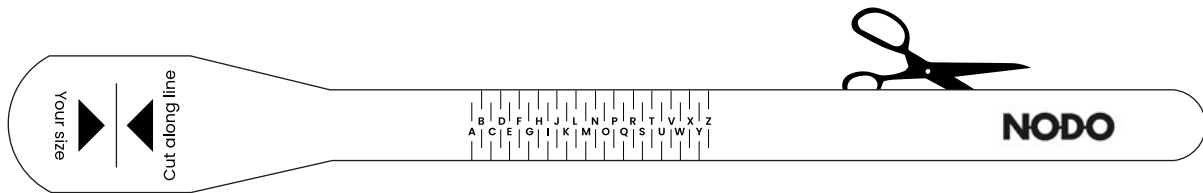
Find your ring size

Print this guide with standard A4 printer paper & make sure it is printed 'Actual Size'.
Ensure the lines below measures 5 centimeters / 2 inches.



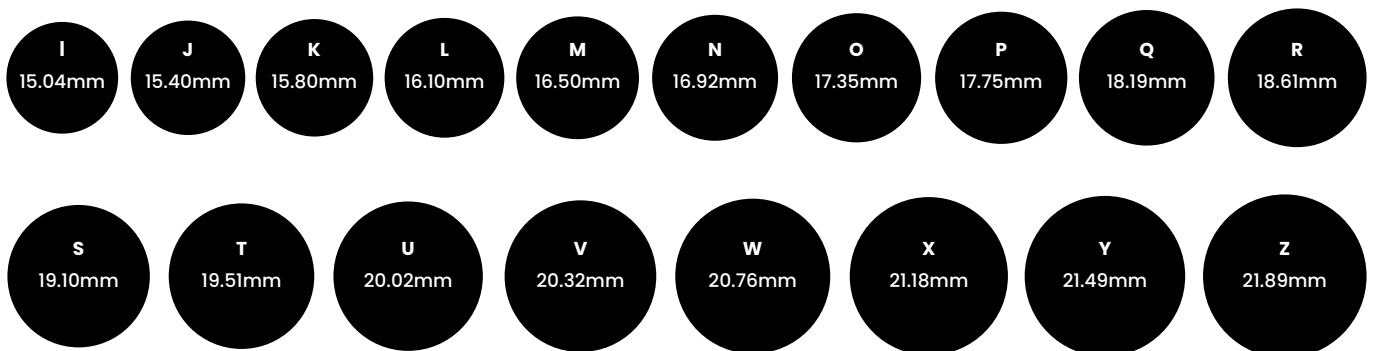
Measure your Finger

- Cut around the edge of the ring gauge and make a slit on the 'cut along line' area.
- Make a loose circle by slipping the end of the gauge through the slit you have cut.
- Tighten the gauge around your finger to read your size. Be sure not to tighten the gauge too much, it should slide over your knuckle comfortably.
- *Measure your fingers when your hands are warm and not too hot or cold as this will give the most accurate reading. If the reading is between sizes always go for the next size up.*



Measure an Existing Ring

- Select a ring that fits the finger to be sized and place it over the circles below.
- Check your ring against each size until the inside circumference lines up perfectly.
- *Make sure the circle fits snugly inside your existing ring so that the edge of the circle is touching the inside of your ring. If your ring is in between sizes always opt for the next size up.*



Please note: This chart is to be used as a guide only, sizes may vary based on band width, shape of the finger, or even whether your fingers are hot or cold.
